Released Its 2019 Annual Report

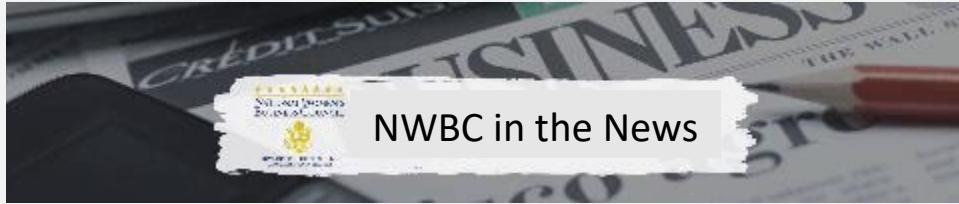
WASHINGTON, D.C., January 10, 2019 – Last month, the National Women's Business Council ([NWBC](#)) submitted its [2019 Annual Report](#) to the President, the Senate Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship, the House Committee on Small Business, and the Administrator of the Small Business Administration.

This report recaps NWBC's 31st year and provides the findings, conclusions, and policy recommendations of the Council. NWBC Chair [Liz Sara](#), now in her second year at the helm, has concentrated its efforts on three important initiatives: improving access to capital for female founders, encouraging more women to start and grow companies in STEM-related fields, and removing obstacles for women business owners in rural areas.

“As the report findings and policy recommendations demonstrate, while we have made significant legislative and economic strides in advancing a new generation of women entrepreneurs, much work still lies ahead,” said Sara. “That is why the work of the Council continues to be vital. In 2020, we will continue our efforts with a laser focus on our three overarching issues areas of primary importance.”
